## **What is dissemination and implementation (D&I) science?**

Studies show it takes many years for effective healthcare innovations to enter widespread clinical practice. This is why implementation science matters: it aims to bridge the gap between what we know works and what actually gets done. NIH defines dissemination and implementation science as follows:

Dissemination is the targeted distribution of information and intervention materials to a specific public health or clinical practice audience. The intent is to spread knowledge and the associated evidence-based interventions.

Implementation is the use of strategies to adopt and integrate evidence-based health interventions and change practice patterns within specific settings.

## **Who should attend the workshop?**

Health researchers and clinicians interested in learning more about D&I science and how to formulate research questions for D&I, design innovative studies and compete successfully for grant funding.

## **Who will teach this workshop?**

Faculty will consist of experts in D&I theory, research design and methods.

## **Why should you attend this workshop?**

Participants will receive grounding in D&I science concepts, strategies and design principles. After attending this workshop, participants will be able to formulate their own D&I research questions, develop D&I plans and identify where to access additional D&I resources. This workshop will also prepare health researchers to incorporate D&I principles into grant proposals for NIH, AHRQ, PCORI and other funding agencies.
